If a friend is worried about an issue outside of school, what would you do?	<i>Comfort them and tell the teacher Do something they like to take their mind off of their problem Sit down and talk to them about their issue Tell your parents you are worried about them</i>
What does the word respect mean to you?	<i>Being kind Treat others how you like to be treated Listen to others thoughts even if you don't agree with them</i>
